COVERAGE UNDER THE GENERAL PERMIT FOR THE DISCHARGE OF STORM WATER FROM SMALL MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS, COUNTY OF CALAVERAS, CALAVERAS COUNTY, WDID #5BO5NP00008

The County of Calaveras submitted an application to obtain coverage under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System General Permit for the Discharge of Storm Water From Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (Small MS4), Order No. 2003-0005-DWQ (General Permit). The application consisted of a Notice of Intent to Comply with the terms of the General Permit, a fee, and a Storm Water Management Program (SWMP). Your SWMP was reviewed by Regional Board staff who determined the SWMP complied with the intent and requirements of the General Permit and federal Phase II Storm Water Regulations. The SWMP was also made available for public comment for 60 days, from 11 September 2007 to 12 December 2007.

In accordance with section A.3 of the General Permit, the steps for obtaining coverage under the General Permit have been fulfilled. As of 13 December 2007 discharges from the County of Calaveras' MS4 are authorized by the General Permit provided you implement and monitor your SWMP and are in full compliance with the requirements and prohibitions of the General Permit.
